- You can volunteer and choose one of two options:
  - Option 1: Volunteer in a position that you are highly visible to your band kid and embarrass the heck out of them
  - Option 2: Find a position that never intersects with your band student or the friends they hang out with
- You can volunteer as little or as much as you like and you are never judged




## **Volunteer Opportunities**

- Band Camp Support (Food and Break Support)
- Uniform Fittings get each kid fitted with uniform, shako, gloves, and shoes
- Field/Props Crew support band on the field during performance and build props
- Front Ensemble Crew assist percussion section onto field/minor maintenance
- Hydration Crew make sure kids stay hydrated during events
- Plumes & Mirrors Crew make finishing touches to uniform prior to performance
- Bus Chaperones hanging out with 40 great kids on a five hour bus ride
- Trailer Support pull trailers to events
- Food Support bring food for events/fundraisers and assist in feeding kids

## **FIELD/PROPS CREW**

- MUST be available for ALL performances
- Stage and assemble props in designated area
- During 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter, stage props at south end of Stocker Stadium
- Carry props back to trailer, disassemble, and load trailer after performances
- Help other crews as necessary



## **UNIFORM FITTINGS**

Uniforms will be handed out during Band Camp week

- 18-20 volunteers needed
  - Step 1: Measuring Kids (6 volunteers)
  - Step 2: Match them with uniform (4 volunteers)
  - Step 3: Try-on uniforms confirm fit (6 volunteers)
  - Step 4: Hand out Shakos and order shoes and gloves (4 volunteers)



## CHAPERONES

- Riding the bus to and from events
- Room checks at hotels
- Assist with food prep, serving, set-up & clean up
- Transport tables, canopies, and food
- Assist with minor medical situations



## **PIT CREW**

- Arrive at performances with trailer
- Assist Students to Unload trailer
- Check for needed repairs
- Stage instruments/carts on track
  - During 2nd quarter for games
  - In staging area for competitions
- Set up performances
  - Enjoy front row seating
- Break down performances and deliver
  back to trailer




## **BAND TRAILERS**

- Big enough truck to haul (needs to be  $\frac{3}{4}$  or 1 ton)
- Pick up trailers FMHS and deliver to performances
- Stage for offloading
  - Arrive 20 minutes before scheduled
- After game and trailer is loaded, back to FMHS
- Unhook trailer at FMHS
- Check with Crabtree about next transport event
- Must be willing to haul to and from State Competition.
- We will need 3-4 drivers for the season and 3–4 backup drivers in case of scheduling issue or truck break down.



## **HYDRATION CREW**

- Available at ALL Events and games
- Carry water bottles to hydrate kids before performances and parades
- At games, retrieve the 5-gallon jugs from trailer, fill with ice and water.
- Check and refill during half time
- Provide drinking cups and trash bags
- Return jugs to trailer



## **PLUMES & MIRRORS**

- Before and After EVERY event and game
- Hand out/insert plumes & mirrors before performance
- Retrieve plumes & mirrors after performance
- Place plume case and mirrors in trailer after each event



## **BAND CAMP VOLUNTEERS**

- Be available for half/ full day shifts at Band Camp
- Set up canopies and tables
- Set up snacks and water jugs
- KEEP WATER JUGS FULL ALL DAY
- Clean up at end of day



## What does it cost? Where do the \$\$\$ go?

**INDIVIDUAL STUDENT FEE:** \$375

TOTAL STUDENT FEES (approx \$34,000)


