## More About FMHS Band Programs

Established in 1910 with a small band of about 20 students, the FMHS music program has grown not only in size, but in reputation as a high-quality student activity-exceeding participation rates of athletic teams and consistently ranking in the top 10 at state competitions.

Our marching band, essentially the largest team/high school organization on the western slope, is open to all high school students. There is no audition or requirement other than passion for music. Students dedicate countless hours practicing and performing in all types of conditions: on sun baked blacktop parking lots, snowy fields, cramped practice rooms, to light- and sound-filled concert stages. Each year students are more physically and mentally fit and build skills that will last a lifetime.

Mr. Crabtree, our band director, has stated, "I firmly believe that the impact of this program cannot be measured. Lessons learned are not seen right away. Seeds are planted and often do not come to fruition until years later, or adulthood. I have had students email me years after they have departed the program letting me know the lessons learned, or the quote from a rehearsal, or the work ethic, or the interviews they had to complete that helped them land a RA position, or a job. That is very much the case in most of educationyou can measure the impact of content but not everything else, and it is everything else that will have the impact on students' future life."

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
